
What can I offer?

A Career in Paediatrics

Paediatricians look at specific health issues, diseases and disorders in babies, children and young people. Doctors work with both the patient and their family. Paediatrics is a diverse, stimulating and hugely rewarding specialty.

You could be working in:

- General Paediatric Units, seeing a wide range of conditions affecting children.
- Community-based settings, managing long-term conditions of children and young people.
- Highly specialised units, working in a wide range of sub-specialties such as neonatal medicine, paediatric intensive care medicine or paediatric neurology.

Paediatrics is:

- Forward looking in the way it has embraced flexible training and working: about 17% of consultants work part-time.
- Able to offer enormous opportunities in social and ethical aspects of health care.
- Good for those who enjoy working in a team; a paediatrician works within a multidisciplinary team. For example, you may work with physiotherapists, speech therapists, dieticians or specialist nurses.



Paediatrics in Wales

The Wales School for Paediatrics and Child Health was established in 2007 and works closely with the RCPCH to provide the highest quality paediatric training and education. Trainees can apply to train on either the North Wales/Mersey programme or the South Wales programme. The School provides excellent support for trainees in all aspects of their training and has appointed a number of lead consultants in the following areas: Education, Less-Than Full-Time Training, Performance and Quality Assurance. There are over 160 trainees on the programme, undertaking placements in general paediatrics, neonatology and sub-specialties including oncology, neurology, respiratory, community, renal, gastroenterology, PICU, endocrinology, cardiology, emergency medicine and palliative care medicine.

The current structure of the NHS in Wales, with Health Boards encompassing primary, secondary and tertiary care, enables a holistic approach to service delivery and patient care. There are clear pathways of referral, with clearly identified "hubs" for tertiary care both in North and South Wales.

There is a strong sense of community amongst paediatricians in Wales, facilitated by the Welsh Paediatric Society.

The Wales Deanery has processes in place to continually review the training provided in order to ensure the delivery of high quality training programmes and excellent patient care.
