Combined Training FAQs

Q – Are Accreditation of Transferable Capabilities (ATC) and Certificate of Completion of Training (CCT CP) the same thing?

A – No, they are two separate schemes. For more information on each scheme please visit [Combined training \(rcgp.org.uk\)](http://rcgp.org.uk)

Q – Can I apply for combined training after I have started training?

A – No, you will not be able to apply after you have started GP training.

Q – I have not indicated on my application form that I would like to apply for this scheme, can I still apply?

A – If you have not stipulated on your application form that you would like to apply, you are unfortunately unable to apply retrospectively for this scheme.

Q – Will my training only be reduced by six months?

A – Yes, the amount of time that can be used for both ATC and CCT (CP), is limited to no more than six months.

Q – What evidence do I need to provide?

A – Please refer to our ATC and CCT (CP) process charts which can be found on our website [Combined training for GP trainees - HEIW \(nhs.wales\)](http://nhs.wales) which outlines the evidence needed on each scheme.

Q – Do you reduce my hospital or general practice posts?

A – Your hospital posts will be reduced from 12 months to six months. You will complete your hospital post at ST1 where possible.

Q – Can I apply if I received a low MSRA score?

A – No, we will not accept a MSRA score 480 or below

Q – When will I have my first ARCP?

A – Your first ARCP will take place six or seven months after you commence your training. Your ATC/CCT (CP) application will be discussed at the panel and a decision will be made on whether you are eligible to continue with the scheme.
