Glangwili Hospital



Glangwili General Hospital, located in Carmarthen, is the largest of the four main hospitals in Hywel Dda University Health Board. The hospital provides emergency medicine, general surgery, trauma and orthopaedics and general medical services. Diagnostic and therapies, radiology, midwifery, woman and children's services are also available here.

Glangwili hospital also provides:

- A purpose-built Emergency Unit for emergency admissions.
- The Clinical Decisions Unit providing the highest standard of care for acutely sick patients
- A large modern Adult Critical Care Unit
- Stroke Unit with a dedicated stroke team
- Core cardiac services for the population of Carmarthenshire
- Gastrointestinal bleed services for the southern area of the University Health Board.

Transport Links

Carmarthen offers excellent transport links with close proximity to the M4. There are good road and rail links to Pembrokeshire in the west and Cardiff and England to the east.

The Team consists of two Consultants supervising this post:

Dr A Gupta- main supervisor- COTE with interest in Osteoporosis and Orthogeriatrics

Trainees in this post are bale to learn and practice Evidence Based Medicine in an acute District hospital at Glangwili, Carmarthen. Most of the acute specialities are based here. We work in a friendly environment with easily approachable specialists. The consultant GI Bleed rota is based here out of all 4 hospitals in Hywel DDaUHB. The on- call General Medical rota for acute medical admissions to hospital includes all adult age groups plus elderly patients.

On calls are always supervised with a Medical Registrar available on site 24 hours/day. Foundation doctors gain experience of working in the Clinical Decision Unit and Ambulatory care with other Acute Physicians when on call. Consultant is present onsite from 0800 to 2000 during weekdays. Trainees also gain experience of patient management in the Coronary Care Unit during on call.

Elective and emergency management of surgical patients (general/upper GI/colorectal) in a typical district general hospital. Particular emphasis on minimal access surgery and endoscopic intervention. Management of critically ill surgical patients.

This post offers rounded experience in General and Colorectal surgery across the breadth of speciality. The post also provides experience in assessment and management of emergency surgical and Critically III Surgical patients. Under clinical and educational supervision of experienced consultants, the doctor will have opportunities to achieve appropriate competencies and is encouraged to participate in Service Improvement Projects.

Post-holder is part of 5 FY1 doctors supported by ANPs, F2/CTs and Registrars under close supervision of Consultants. The work pattern comprises a combination of normal day, Day and Night On-calls on a fully compliant rota.

The team is led by two consultants and consists of two Specialty doctors, 1 x IMT, 1 x Clinical Fellow an FY2 and FY1 trainee.

Juniors are expected to attend 4 consultant-led ward rounds per week and one middle grade led ward round. The patient mix is predominantly cardiology and general internal medicine.

Our foundation doctors together with the team, will look after a total of 24 patients on the general cardiology ward but also be involved in the care of 4 patients on CCU. Foundation doctors currently attend a daily ward round in the new ACS treat and repatriate bay catering for acute cardiac patients across the Health board awaiting invasive management at the Morriston Cardiac Centre. This is a very valuable teaching opportunity within the setting of urgent cardiology.



Plans for a full-time ANP to support the foundation/junior doctors are in place and imminent.

Foundation doctors will be carrying out daily tasks such as core bedside procedures, completing electronic medication take homes and discharge summaries. We have at least two teaching rounds per week where foundation doctors are encouraged to present and discuss cases. The on-call commitment is 1:20 with prospective cover, the foundation doctors will have a mix of on-call responsibilities between clerking patients through the acute medical admissions unit for a largely unselected medical take to providing general ward cover. The foundation doctors are always supervised by a middle grade and consultant during on-call.

Trainees are encouraged to attend cardiology clinics, non-invasive and invasive cardiac investigation lists for their own interest and education

Duties include primary care clinic based and procedure based where applicable such as patient assessment, review and management of both acute and long term conditions.

Duties and activities suited to clinical sessions

- 1. Supervised or supported consultations within the practice, with a minimum appointment length of 15 and most commonly of 20 minutes for face to face consultations. There will be adequate time provided for at the end of any consulting period to allow a trainee to debrief with the supervising GP.
- 2. Supervised or supported home visits, nursing home visits, community hospital duties including time for debriefing, and travelling.
- 3. Administrative work that directly and indirectly supports clinical care, which includes: reviewing investigations and results, writing referral letters, acting upon clinical letters, preparing reports, general administration.



- 4. Time spent with other members of the practice and healthcare team for the purposes of care and learning e.g. practice nurses, community nurses, nurses with a role in chronic disease management, receptionists, triage nurses, etc.
- 5. Time spent with other healthcare professionals who are encountered in primary care e.g. ambulance crews, school nurses, midwives, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, counsellors, to gain a necessary understanding of working relationships within primary care.
- 6. Time spent with dispensing and pharmacy professionals gaining experience in these areas, especially where a trainee might have duties that require training to be able to assist with dispensing duties, for example.

This post offers the opportunity to be part of a friendly and dynamic team of gastroenterology consultants, Dieticians and specialist nurses. The trainee will have the opportunity to have exposure to, and be involved in the active management of a wide range of luminal and hepatology related conditions that are seen as an in-patient in Prince Phillip Hospital including complex inflammatory bowel disease, Decompensated liver disease, Gastrointestinal malignancies and advanced nutritional related pathologies. The trainee will benefit from regular consultant ward rounds and bed side teaching that will build knowledge and clinical reasoning. All members of the team are encouraged to seek out educational opportunities in particular attending outpatients to both observe and see patients themselves. Specialist clinics run regularly in PPH including complex IBD, Liver disease comprising of viral hepatitis and post liver transplant follow up alongside general gastroenterology referrals. There will also be an opportunity to attend the endoscopy



department to observe both Upper and lower Gastrointestinal endoscopy which will include therapeutics, and all trainees are expected to complete the attachment being competent in performing abdominal paracentesis. Alongside their usual ward duties the junior doctor will also be part of the general medical rota and have the opportunity to see acutely unwell medical patients being admitted to the acute medical assessment unit while being a part of the Medical emergency Team (MET) and attending acute stroke thrombolysis calls.

The Team consists of 2 x SPR, 2 x SHO, 1 x FY2, and 1FY1. Juniors are expected to turn up a little earlier in turns (8.45 am) to update the list for ward round. The doctor who comes in at 0845 can leave at 16.45. Ward round usually starts at 9 am. All members of the team attend the ward round and try to complete urgent jobs as they go around and keep the board up to date with jobs for the nurses. Trainees then continue with jobs, chase results and review patients as required until 5pm. It is important to handover any urgent test results or unwell patients to evening SHO/SPR between 4.30pm - 5pm.

It is expected at the beginning of the rotation or if possible before starting, to express any planned annual or study leave with the team and rota co-ordinator. This will be granted as per staffing levels.

In addition, there is the opportunity to gain experience in the management of critically unwell and injured children and young people, both in the emergency and elective setting. The duty rota is based on normal days, long days and nights in. Trainees are encouraged to attend many other clinical activities including CAMHS, Specialist ENT, Ophthalmology and tertiary clinics. There will be clinical meetings in Diabetes and Endocrinology and in General Medicine. Foundation doctors are expected to present clinical cases and contribute to the journal club discussion. All team members are encouraged to undertake a Quality Improvement Project or audit during the attachment.

The F2 will be trained in the management of acute presentations in Diabetes and Endocrinology during their ward experience. Experience in the management of diabetes and endocrine disorders will be gained in outpatient clinics. Experience in managing the acutely unwell patients will be gained when attending the daily consultant post-take ward rounds on the admission wards.

The duties include supervision and assisting the F1 in the day-to-day management of inpatients, liaison between the F1 and seniors .There is a daily Board Round that the F2 needs to attend and a detailed list of the inpatients that has to be prepared before ward round. There will be exposure to a variety of outpatient clinics and if interested, to work with multidisciplinary members of the Diabetes and Endocrinology team including specialist nurses, dietitians, and podiatrists.

The F2 is an integral part of the Cardiology team in GGH, working with an F1, Clinical Fellow/IMT/ANP (2 posts) an SPR and a specialty doctor. The team is led by 4 cardiologists who provide daily input to the wards and CCU. The team look after 6 patients in CCU, 6 in the cardiac step-down unit and 10 on Towy Ward (with occasional outlying patients). The junior doctors are given the opportunity to spend time gaining experience in ECG interpretation, basic echocardiography, basic pacing and angiography. More senior doctors are trained in some of the advanced techniques and the junior doctors are encouraged to develop a better understanding of these.

F2s take part in a 1:11 on-call rota where they will be on-call with either an F1 or F2 and a middle grade. A 'twilight' doctor helps in the evenings. There is also a night nurse practitioner on at night to support. There is a consultant presence from 8am-8pm Monday to Friday and for much of the weekend. There is always a consultant on-call from home who is available 24/7.

The F2s are supported to attend educational events in the postgraduate department and are given careers advice and support from the consultants. They are also supported to fulfil the curriculum requirements.
