The Ward 3 patients are split between the three Respiratory Consultants, taking into account the sub specialty interests, but the team is shared and looks after the whole ward. Within the role you will be involved in managing patients with respiratory failure, including non-invasive ventilation on the ward. You will also be managing patients with pleural disease including a variety of chest drains. Competency training in NIV is led by our senior respiratory nurse specialist. Pleural procedures should be learned in the skills lab in postgraduate department, and training is led by our registrars and teaching fellows. When time permits junior doctors are encouraged to attend pleural clinics on Monday afternoons to have the opportunity to learn pleural aspiration and chest drain insertion skills

The team is led by two consultants and consists of two Specialty doctors, 1 x IMT, 1 x Clinical Fellow an FY2 and FY1 trainee.

Juniors are expected to attend 4 consultant-led ward rounds per week and one middle grade led ward round. The patient mix is predominantly cardiology and general internal medicine.

Our foundation doctors together with the team, will look after a total of 24 patients on the general cardiology ward but also be involved in the care of 4 patients on CCU. Foundation doctors currently attend a daily ward round in the new ACS treat and repatriate bay catering for acute cardiac patients across the Health board awaiting invasive management at the Morriston Cardiac Centre. This is a very valuable teaching opportunity within the setting of urgent cardiology.

Plans for a full-time ANP to support the foundation/junior doctors are in place and imminent.

Foundation doctors will be carrying out daily tasks such as core bedside procedures, completing electronic medication take homes and discharge summaries. We have at least two teaching rounds per week where foundation doctors are encouraged to present and discuss cases.

The on-call commitment is 1:20 with prospective cover, the foundation doctors will have a mix of on-call responsibilities between clerking patients through the acute medical admissions unit for a largely unselected medical take to providing general ward cover. The foundation doctors are always supervised by a middle grade and consultant during on-call.

Trainees are encouraged to attend cardiology clinics, non-invasive and invasive cardiac investigation lists for their own interest and education.

At least two of our ward rounds per week are teaching ward rounds as described. Juniors will present cases themselves and a discussion will follow regarding the diagnosis and management. We have weekly cardiology team meetings where juniors will choose and present topics for discussion.

Duties include primary care clinic based and procedure based where applicable such as patient assessment, review and management of both acute and long term conditions.

Duties and activities suited to clinical sessions

- 1. Supervised or supported consultations within the practice, with a minimum appointment length of 15 and most commonly of 20 minutes for face to face consultations. There will be adequate time provided for at the end of any consulting period to allow a trainee to debrief with the supervising GP.
- 2. Supervised or supported home visits, nursing home visits, community hospital duties including time for debriefing, and travelling.
- 3. Administrative work that directly and indirectly supports clinical care, which includes: reviewing investigations and results, writing referral letters, acting upon clinical letters, preparing reports, general administration.
- 4. Time spent with other members of the practice and healthcare team for the purposes of care and learning e.g. practice nurses, community nurses, nurses with a role in chronic disease management, receptionists, triage nurses, etc.
- 5. Time spent with other healthcare professionals who are encountered in primary care e.g. ambulance crews, school nurses, midwives, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, counsellors, to gain a necessary understanding of working relationships within primary care.



6. Time spent with dispensing and pharmacy professionals gaining experience in these areas, especially where a trainee might have duties that require training to be able to assist with dispensing duties, for example.

The ENT department in West Wales provides the full range of ENT services to a widely dispersed largely rural population. There are three FY2 doctors and 1 FY1 doctor working with a core surgical trainee and GPST at first on-call level. The junior tier is supported by six registrar level doctors including one higher surgical trainee in ENT, and six consultant ENT surgeons. We have a very strong team working ethos and all doctors work closely together and provide support for colleagues as needed. Duties consist of management of elective and emergency inpatients on the adult ENT and paediatric wards. The on-call rota for F2 doctors covers emergency ENT admissions until 8:30pm weekdays and weekends, with cross-cover for ENT and urology admissions overnight. The F1 doctor gains experience in managing general surgical admissions on-call.

Our department is well staffed with junior doctors which allows ample opportunity for foundation doctors to attend outpatient clinics and spend time in the operating theatre. In addition to gaining the generic competencies required of all doctors we encourage our trainees to improve their experience of outpatient management of common ENT conditions, and many Foundation doctors have been able to start a logbook of surgical cases they have been involved in. This time in theatre stands them in good stead when applying for further training jobs. A significant proportion of our patient group is aged less than 18 which provides paediatric exposure for those doctors considering a career in paediatric medicine or general practice.

This post offers the opportunity to be part of a friendly and dynamic team of gastroenterology consultants, Dieticians and specialist nurses. The trainee will have the opportunity to have exposure to, and be involved in the active management of a wide range of luminal and hepatology related conditions that are seen as an in-patient in Prince Philip Hospital including complex inflammatory bowel disease, Decompensated liver disease, Gastrointestinal malignancies and advanced nutritional related pathologies. The trainee will benefit from regular consultant ward rounds and bed side teaching that will build knowledge and clinical reasoning. All members of the team are encouraged to seek out educational opportunities in particular attending outpatients to both observe and see patients themselves. Specialist clinics run regularly in PPH including complex IBD, Liver disease comprising of viral hepatitis and post liver transplant follow up alongside general gastroenterology referrals. There will also be an opportunity to attend the endoscopy department to observe both Upper and lower Gastrointestinal endoscopy which will include therapeutics, and all trainees are expected to complete the attachment being competent in performing abdominal paracentesis. Alongside their usual ward duties the junior doctor will also be part of the general medical rota and have the opportunity to see acutely unwell medical patients being admitted to the acute medical assessment unit while being a part of the Medical emergency Team (MET) and attending acute stroke thrombolysis calls.

To join the busy team at the department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology where there are 3200 maternity delivery per annum and 6000-8000 gynae referrals. To participate in European time directive compliant rota of 1 in 11 at first on call level. There is plenty of opportunity to gain experience in both obstetric and gynae emergencies on the Labour Ward, Antenatal/ Post Natal Ward, Gynae Ward, elective caesarean list and elective gynae theatre. There is an opportunity to attend out-patient clinics of both obstetrics and gynae to develop clinical skills in the Specialty such as obtaining history, clinical examinations, interpreting results and to formulate management plans. There is also the chance to attend special interest clinics such as hysteroscopy, colposcopy, urodynamics, early pregnancy and antenatal day assessment unit depending on the availability. When Foundation Doctors are on call during the night are supported by the night Nurse Practitioners as well as direct Registrar supervision. Foundation Doctors attend the Ward round which are supervised by Senior team members. Also, they have an opportunity to attend the MDT meeting and Risk Management meetings.

Keep board up to date with jobs for nurses. Complete jobs after ward rounds. Continue with jobs, chase results and review patients as required until 5pm. Handover any urgent test results or unwell patients to evening SHO/SPR between 4.30pm - 5pm.

It is expected at the beginning of the rotation or if possible before starting to express any planned annual or study leave with the team and rota co-ordinator. This will be granted as per staffing levels.

Audit and service development ideas are welcomed in addition to the journal club participation.

This placement provides the trainee with an opportunity to learn the management of patients with acute stroke and their rehabilitation and it allows the opportunity to learn the management of Parkinson's disease, learn the principles of rehabilitation, develop experience in the management of acutely ill patients presenting as an emergency. The department encourages active MDT working, which allows the trainee to develop interpersonal relationships and be an effective team player. The department will provide opportunities for diagnostic procedures and audit.



Team consists of 1 middle grade, 3 SHO grade, 1XFY1 and 1XFY2. The main responsibility of Foundation doctors is in the wards. They attend ward rounds and complete jobs when ward round finishes. They also attend MDT meetings in the stroke and rehabilitation wards. The doctors spend 2 months of their rotation in the stroke ward and other 2 months in the rehabilitation ward.

The F2 doctor is part of a team which includes a consultant haematologist, an F1 doctor and a haematology specialist nurse. Inpatients are seen daily on a consultant led ward round. The team also has responsibility for day-case patients attending for chemotherapy, blood and blood product transfusions in the chemotherapy unit and day hospital.

Palliative Care:

The palliative care service includes a consultant, associate specialist, registrar and F1 and has a 7 bedded hospice on site. The team also do regular ward rounds providing advice on medical inpatients.

There are excellent learning opportunities to gain the competencies necessary for the FY2 year. Procedures that can be learnt, other that the core competencies include bone marrow biopsies, PICC and Hickman line removals. There is also the opportunity to gain exposure to laboratory services including blood film and bone marrow reporting.

GGH is a busy district general hospital which admits general and speciality trauma from across the entire health board; 350-400 hip fractures are admitted per year. We are the designated trauma unit for Hywel Dda within the south wales major trauma network. There are 2 f2 doctors, 8 trust grade core trainees and a surgical scrub practitioner on the SHO level rota. There



are 10 middle grade doctors, including 2 higher surgical trainees and 11 consultants undertaking a 1 in 8 on call. We also have 3 specialist trauma nurses and a consultant physician with an interest in peri-operative care. We have strong links with Swansea and Cardiff university and encourage involvement with research and quality improvement activities. Our department ensures appropriate clinical and educational supervision for all junior medical staff and this post prepares all junior doctors well for whichever training program they wish to apply for.

The F2 is an integral part of the Cardiology team in GGH, working with an F1, Clinical Fellow/IMT/ANP (2 posts) an SPR and a specialty doctor. The team is led by 4 cardiologists who provide daily input to the wards and CCU. The team look after 6 patients in CCU, 6 in the cardiac step-down unit and 10 on Towy Ward (with occasional outlying patients). The junior doctors are given the opportunity to spend time gaining experience in ECG interpretation, basic echocardiography, basic pacing and angiography. More senior doctors are trained in some of the advanced techniques and the junior doctors are encouraged to develop a better understanding of these.

F2s take part in a 1:11 on-call rota where they will be on-call with either an F1 or F2 and a middle grade. A 'twilight' doctor helps in the evenings. There is also a night nurse practitioner on at night



to support. There is a consultant presence from 8am-8pm Monday to Friday and for much of the weekend. There is always a consultant on-call from home who is available 24/7.

The F2s are supported to attend educational events in the postgraduate department and are given careers advice and support from the consultants. They are also supported to fulfil the curriculum requirements.

Daily ward rounds give excellent opportunity to see acute urological admissions, present new cases to senior colleagues, review scans, ask questions and learn about investigations and treatment of urological cases. F2 is expected to perform as many male and female catheterisations on the ward and by attending Urology CNS led clinics, insert cannula, perform blood cultures and learn how to look after emergency admissions under supervision.

F2 doctors are encouraged to attend theatre, day surgery units and MDT discussions to see the continuity of care.
